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SureWest Telephone (SWT) hereby submits its 2014 WMDVBE Annual Report and 2015
Annual Plan in compliance with Sections 9 and 10 of General Order 156 (GO 156) of the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) and subsequent Decisions (D.)

The WMDVBE Administrator assists many who participate in any procurement activities providing WMDVBE suppliers with equitable opportunities to compete with NON-WMDVBE suppliers for procurement and subcontracting opportunities with SureWest.

Although SureWest is committed to our WMDVBE Program, we do not utilize preferences or set asides to reach our goals.

Our WMDVBE program is part of the Purchasing Department's staff meetings. We also participated in numerous DVBE meetings/conference calls with other regulated utility representatives.

Our purchasing staff continues to meet with WMDVBE company representatives to discuss possible purchasing opportunities.

The above activities provide opportunities for WMDVBEs to promote their products and/or services while allowing SureWest to encourage program participation.

This filing in compliance with the requirements of CPUC, General Order 156 includes an Annual Plan of the WMDVBE - Supplier Diversity Program of SureWest and certain of its Commission regulated affiliates.

SureWest policy is to promote, increase and improve the quality of the overall participation of minority, women and disabled Veteran owned business enterprises(WMDVBE) in our purchases of materials and services.

Part of our WMDVBE program is to encourage our other affiliates whose activities are not covered by this filing, but are committed to the program.

SureWest's regulated procurement with Clearinghouse-verified diverse suppliers totaled \$1,476,317 or 8.80%. Not included in the above listed spend is an additional \$544,845 overall spent with suppliers that have Small Business Certifications.

SureWest continues to utilize the WMBE Clearinghouse and the Department of General Services (DGS) Business Certification as primary resources to identify and recruit certified suppliers.

We are seeing fewer qualified vendors in our service area to select from. Many of the suppliers certified through the DGS are a duplication of the WMBE Clearinghouse database.

This year we have again found that the number of verified subcontractors has declined. The results of this continue to be evident in this year's results.

SureWest recognizes that the limited availability of MBEs in our geographical area continues to have an effect on meeting/exceeding our goals.

As we continue identifying WMDVBEs it is still evident that the women businesses far exceed the minority and SDV businesses. SureWest remains confident that through our outreach program and the Clearinghouse we will be able to identify and increase our minority and service disabled veteran percentages.

SureWest has included in its percentages only vendors that are listed in the database as "VERIFIED".

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SureWest has established and maintains a subcontracting program for the purpose of encouraging its prime contractors to utilize WMBE subcontractors. Disabled Veterans are included in this program. SureWest will provide a current list of service disabled veterans suppliers to the prime contractor or provide the necessary information if they wish to obtain their own.

The subcontracting program serves as an enhancement to and not as a replacement for, our WMDVBE prime contractor outreach program.

SureWest abides by the guidelines in 6.3.2.1, 6.3.2.2 and 6.3.2.3 and has included them in its subcontracting section of its policy.

The subcontracting program at this time is not mandatory to the procurement of products manufactured for general consumption such as paper, pens, etc. or products and services in excluded categories.

Many of our prime contractors have subcontracting programs of their own, and report quarterly on the progress of finding subcontractors that have the required certifications.

CONTINUED

SureWest encourages, and will assist its prime contractors in developing plans to increase the utilization of WMDVBEs as subcontractors. Prime contractors will be encouraged to submit plans to the utility, that include goals for the utilization of WMDVBEs as subcontractors.

Although, at this time, our prime contractors have not set goals in percentages as the utility companies do, they do report dollar amounts awarded to WMDVBE subcontractors on any work done for SureWest.

SureWest continues to work with many of its prime suppliers and contractors regarding the importance of subcontracting to WMDVBE and the necessity to verify the legitimacy of the vendor and to also track the dollars spent in the subcontracting mode. We have supplied prime contractors with the pamphlets provided by the Clearinghouse and a copy of the General Order. We are aware of the delay in verifying WMBEs for both direct and subcontracting purchases, these delays are a result of various circumstances.

SureWest will continue to contact, the WMBE vendors both by letters and phone calls, to encourage them to take the time to fill out the VAP (Verification Application Package). SureWest is also encouraging the prime suppliers and/or contractors to contact the DGS or go on line for a current list of verified Disabled Veterans not verified by the Clearinghouse at this time.

SureWest will provide its current copy of the above mentioned list if the prime supplier/contractor cannot find the time to request one.

SureWest has, at this time, not found it necessary to include a statement that subcontracting with WMDVBEs is a factor that will be considered in the bid evaluation process since we find most prime contractors have a very positive attitude towards utilizing WMDVBEs as subcontractors.

SureWest provides a mechanism through which WMDVBE contractors or prospective WMDVBE contractors can present complaints to the utility's management.

Complaints shall first be submitted to the WMDVBE Administrator within a reasonable time after the event complained of. WMDVBEs will be encouraged to make their complaint in writing.

Complaints will be reviewed and investigated by the administrator and the administrator's decision will be communicated to the complainant within twenty (20) working days of receipt of the complaint.

In the event that a WMDVBE believes that SureWest WMDVBE Administrator's decision, or any other act or omission of the utility, violates any provision of law or of any order or rule of the Commission, the WMDVBE may file a complaint with the Commission pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 1702 and Article 3 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedures. In compliance with G.O.156, SureWest will answer such complaints within thirty (30) days.

- b) Continuous training for employees, to include Clearinghouse database (its revisions and results).
- c) Workshops with the Clearinghouse staff.
- d) Attend seminars and vendor fairs involved in WMDVBE outreach.
- e) Continue, through the Chambers of Commerce, and other business organizations, literature, advertising etc. to be aware of newly identified WMDVBE vendors in our geographical area.
- f) Participate with other Chambers of Commerce not in our area.
- g) Have available handouts containing summary of G.O.156.
- h) Monitor procurement policy regarding subcontracting to be included if needed.
- i) Continue participating in meetings with other regulated utilities to share ideas about the WMDVBE program.

ALL OF THE ABOVE INFORMATION WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE TO ALL EMPLOYEES WITH ANY PROCUREMENT RESPONSIBILITIES.

A description of WMDVBE program planned for the next calendar year. External program activities.

SureWest will continue to interface and network with other organizations to identify WMDVBEs for procurement opportunities, to provide an exchange of ideas to enhance our WMDVBE program.

Our Purchasing Staff will continue to meet with WMDVBE company representatives to discuss possible purchasing opportunities.

Our plan will include providing opportunities for procurement personnel to participate in external outreach activities such as tradeshows, meetings, conferences, and workshops

Identify and refer certified and qualified diverse suppliers to departments where diverse spending is low and to also share this information with prime suppliers.

Plans for recruiting WMDVBE suppliers of products or services where WMDVBE utilization has 'been low, such as financial and legal services, fuel procurement, and areas that are considered highly technical in nature.

SureWest will continue to seek qualified WMDVBEs for products and services where utilization has been low, through our outreach program, the Clearinghouse, vendor fairs, and whatever means we deem necessary.

Plans for seeking and/or recruiting WMDVBE suppliers of products or services in any "excluded 'category" of products or services which has been removed from the procurement dollar base used to set goals because of the established unavailability of WMDVBE suppliers.

SureWest has, since the beginning of the WMDVBE program, continued to seek out a number of qualified, verified suppliers for some of the products/services in our previous excluded category.

Many of the products/services in this category may require a specific design for particular or technical use, which may slow down the process of numerous vendors entering into these fields.

SureWest program administrator will participate in the procurement process of significant company contracts and will encourage bid procurement personnel to expand opportunities for WMDVBE vendors in the product/service categories in which they are available.

Plans for encouraging both prime contractors and grantees to engage WMDVBEs in subcontracts in all categories which provide subcontracting opportunities.

SureWest will continue to encourage prime contractors to engage WMDVBEs as subcontractors in all categories. As we have been satisfied with the cooperation we have received we will continue to encourage and monitor dollars spent with WMDVEs and hopefully locate WMDVBE prime contractors.

SureWest remains firmly committed to achieve the maximum practical utilization of WMDVBEs and to strive to increase our annual results.

The award of any subcontracting is the sole direction of the prime.

Plans for complying with the WMDVBE program guidelines established by the Commission as required by Public Utilities Section 8283 (c). The Executive Director's Office will be responsible for developing, periodically refining, and recommending such guidelines for the Commission's adoption.

SureWest will continue to comply with all guidelines required by GO 156.
