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Message from the Presidents



We are pleased to submit the 2020 GO 156 Supplier Diversity Report showcasing our continued support and achievement of Supplier Diversity efforts and goals met. This is a joint report by both Golden State Water Company (GSWC) and Bear Valley Electric Service, Inc. (BVES). 2020 proved to be a difficult year for so many on varied fronts. GSWC and BVES were identified as essential services providers and we were able to maintain core infrastructure operations to provide delivery of clean, safe, reliable water and dependable power, respectively, during this most crucial time. Golden State Water Company 2020 Annual WMDVLGBTBE Report

Since the initial beginnings of the Memorandum of Intent for Utility Supplier Diversity Programs, Golden State Water Company (GSWC) has been present and, in the forefront, championing and supporting Supplier Diversity initiatives internally and externally. GSWC was the initial representative for all Class A Water Utilities until each of the remaining six Class A Water Utilities developed their Supplier Diversity Programs.

Following established Supplier Diversity Program components and creating administrative dials and tasks to support them, GSWC remains a solid advocate and partner for diverse suppliers, Joint Utilities and the diverse supplier community at large.

Our constant commitment and support from then until now has not waivered. The happenings of 2020, has caused us to be reminded of a statement attributed to the Greek philosopher Heraclitus: "The only constant in life is change." Change is not only a constant but requires actions such as review, revise, create and execute.

GSWC's Supplier Diversity Program has taken the shifts in "normal" program work such as in-person outreach events, visible Community Based Organization partnerships and trainings, service area community sponsorships and has successfully pivoted to virtual platforms with all Supplier Diversity partners.

As the messages resulting from COVID-19 identification and precautions, social/racial unrest, lack of inclusion or focused exclusion of communities of color, across all industries and walks of life unfolded during 2020; new and existing issues specifically impacting diverse suppliers, to wit African American suppliers, were uncovered and became more visual.

GSWC found it imperative to review and implement program changes where necessary. Upon further examination of the issues affecting diverse communities at large, African American diverse suppliers within those communities and of course, more specifically the impact and meaning of those messages to our Supplier Diversity Program.

While we continued our outreach and support of all things Supplier Diversity, our 2020 highlights will show a pivot towards addressing and actively creating and providing outreach specific to African American business owners. GSWC completed necessary and immediate pivots to our former, very robust and in-person outreach activities.

We maintained our visibility within the Supplier Diversity Community and provided assurance that we are continuing to be advocates and supporters in this very new and yet historical landscape. These updates included a swift introduction and learning of available virtual platforms and delivery methods to effectively contribute and continue our Supplier Diversity discussion. We believe that we were successful in this new virtual outreach approach.

Our highlights will show that GSWC was not in this effort alone. GSWC gratefully stood alongside and learned with several organizations and Joint Utility partners to initiate Supplier Diversity Program directional change and continue the move towards a more inclusive platform in this new landscape. This annual CWA USDP event was delivered virtually in 2020. Designed and facilitated by Summer Sepulveda,





 Collaborated/Participated with Joint Utility partners and a Community Based Organization to develop and deliver virtual outreach events focused on African American owned Disadvantaged Business Enterprises.

African American Utility Educational Series

GSWC was invited for a seat at this table by Joint Utility partners to bring line of sight to pain points and discuss opportunities and seek solutions. This four-part series kicked off in April 2020 and attracted well over 150 participants at each session. Attendance was open to all diverse suppliers, with an intended focus on African American business owners. Utilities presented on high spend category opportunities and had real conversation about issues and barriers faced. We have committed to resume this forum for 2021. Please stay informed.



Shades Of Success

GSWC led this event and collaborated with California American Water to specifically focus on African American Women business owners that were members of WBEC West. Vice President Jaymee Lomax facilitated this event and encouraged open and transparent conversation. We were intentional, given our experience and metrics, that this event would need to have a specific focus to address the



wide disparity in utilization of African American Women business owners. This single-day, two-session event was designed to attract an audience that could meet and hold discussions to allow specific business offerings of products /services for Construction and Engineering or those that offered experience in providing Professional Services. We estimate 90 suppliers joined virtually for introduction, information and broad discussion that will hopefully help in their pursuit of utility/supplier partnership.

• Continued active participation of 2020 CWA USDP W.A.T.E.R. program.

Currently in its second year, Water Acumen Training for Entrepreneurial Refinement (W.A.T.E.R.) is designed as a four-course, interactive diverse supplier development forum to inform, educate and introduce diverse suppliers to all seven California Class A Water utilities. Diverse suppliers from industries that could potentially support and provide services utilized by the Utilities are invited to join this cohort. Participants learn about water delivery methods, rate making processes in compliance with Regulatory Agency guidelines and independent variations to these topics from each Utility. In addition, a customized experience is provided to participants to understand the similarities and differences to each Utility relative to Procurement Practices, access to opportunities and relationship building with Supplier Diversity Managers as advocates to help them navigate through Utility processes.

This development project participation does not guarantee contract award, rather gives insight and further knowledge share to diverse suppliers seeking to initiate or expand on already existing partnerships with the Water utilities. This forum successfully pivoted from an in-person delivery to a virtual experience with no lapse

in content, enthusiasm and interactive discussion. The 2020 cohort consists of 18 participants with items of note such as:

- GSWC invited and supports four diverse suppliers in this effort: Amtech, Global Electric, KJD Group and Termicon, Inc.
- Two of the four suppliers are currently in business relationships with GSWC and were invited to create additional exposure to Water Utilities and increase the potential for additional partnerships.
- One W.A.T.E.R. cohort, Triumph Technologies, provided cyber security toolkits to inform and support necessary pivots due to COVID-19. Items in the toolkits provided personal and professional safety tips and tools to GSWC employees and the enterprise.

The momentum to design and customize events with all community-based organizations and diverse suppliers is very full and robust. 2021 will bring greater innovation and efforts as the COVID-19 pivot continues. Stay encouraged!


Sec. 10.1.4 Plans for Recruiting WMDVLGBTBE Suppliers Where Unavailable


