# **Safety and Emergency Information**

# **Public Comment**

### Item # 50 [13949] – Procurement Targets for Combined Heat and Power

**R13-12-010** – Order Instituting Rulemaking to Integrate and Refine Procurement Policies and Consider Long-Term Procurement Plans.

### Ratesetting

### **PROPOSED OUTCOME:**

 Establishes procurement targets for Combined Heat and Power (CHP) Projects for the Second Program Period, as anticipated by Decision 10-12-035, the Qualifying Facility and CHP Settlement Agreement. The new emissions reduction target is 2.72 Million Metric Tonnes of emissions reduction from CHP by 2020.

### SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS:

 Ensures reduced emissions from electric generation, thereby improving the health of California residents. Further utilities are directed to assess all CHP offers for their effects on public and environmental health and safety.

### **ESTIMATED COST:**

• To be determined in competitive solicitations for CHP facilities.

# Item # 51 [13953] – Regarding Costs of Complying with Biomethane Standards and Protocols

**R13-02-008** – Order Instituting Rulemaking to Adopt Biomethane Standards and Requirements, Pipeline Open Access Rules, and Related Enforcement Provisions.

### **Quasi-Legislative**

### **PROPOSED OUTCOME:**

- The cost of complying with the health and safety-related standards and protocols adopted in Decision (D.) 14-01-034 shall be borne by the biomethane providers. To encourage the instate production and distribution of biomethane, a monetary incentive program is adopted which awards 50% of the interconnection costs, up to \$1.5 million, for each successful biomethane project that is built over the next five years, subject to the total program funding amount of \$40 million.
- Closes the proceeding.

### SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS:

• Adherence to the biomethane standards and protocols adopted in D.14-01-034 will ensure the safe interconnection, distribution, and use of biomethane by end-use customers.

### **ESTIMATED COST:**

 If biomethane projects are built in California, statewide natural gas bills could increase by \$40 million over a five-year period.
