Order Instituting Rulemaking to Continue the Development of Rates and Infrastructure for Vehicle Electrification.

Quasi-Legislative

Comr. Rechtschaffen - Judge Korpics - Judge Poirier

PROPOSED OUTCOME:

- Adopts a third-party administered statewide transportation electrification infrastructure rebate program.
- Directs the California electrical corporations, specifically, Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Southern California Edison Company, San Diego Gas & Electric Company, Liberty Utilities (CalPeco Electric) LLC, Bear Valley Electric Service Incorporated, and PacifiCorp d/b/a Pacific Power to jointly fund the program and associated activities.

SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS:

- · Program will include requirements to ensure consumer and installer safety.
- Program will include workforce training requirements to support safe infrastructure installations.

ESTIMATED COST:

• Utilities will jointly incur \$1 billion in costs.
